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SUMMARY AND LEARNING OUTCOMES:

General objectives:

students will develop language skills to respond to direct and indirect language situations and structures (oral or written); they will be familiar with linguistic and non-linguistic social rules; they will be familiar with the basic characteristics of Greek culture.

Specific objectives:

students will develop the skills to understand the main points but also some essential details in a developed speech dealing with popular issues related to work, education, entertainment, etc.; students will have the ability to understand, engage in conversations with natural speakers and respond in thematic areas such as: announcements or public information, advertisements in television and radio programs, instructions from employees of various services, stories and descriptions of events, people, objects, spaces, current events or matters of personal/professional interest, education, free time, travel, consumer goods, social relations, etc.; b) written language - students will develop the skills to understand the general meaning and

essential details of written texts and the ability to write in relation to communication situations in thematic areas such as: manuals for the use of different devices, tables and traffic signals, television, radio, artistic programs, brochures and leaflets, newspaper and magazine articles, employment applications, formal and personal correspondence, public services, etc.; students will know and use correctly the basic rules of spelling.
