COURSE SUMMARY AND STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

General Course Objectives: Students will develop language skills to respond to direct and indirect linguistic situations and structures (both orally and in writing). They will become familiar with social linguistic and non-linguistic rules and be introduced to the fundamental characteristics of Greek culture at a beginner level – A1.

Specific Course Objectives:

1. **Development of Basic Language Skills:** Students will acquire and develop the four main language skills — listening, reading, speaking, and writing — in Greek, enabling daily and intercultural communication.
2. **Communication Skills in Various Situations:** Students will be able to understand and produce spoken and written language in practical social, personal, and professional contexts, as well as interpret and write short instructions.
3. **Language Accuracy and Translation:** The course aims to provide students with accuracy in using Greek and a satisfactory level of translation, including understanding and producing simple texts.

Expected Learning Outcomes:

1. **Acquisition of Greek at Beginner Level (A1):** Students will be able to use simple language structures and communicate clearly and accurately in everyday situations.
2. **Intercultural and Social Competence:** Students will understand basic rules of linguistic and non-linguistic interaction in the Greek context and interact appropriately with Greek speakers.
3. **Accurate Use of Language in Speaking and Writing:** Students will be able to read, understand, and translate simple texts and prepare structured expressions and sentences in Greek.
