SUMMARY AND STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

General Course Objectives: This course aims to prepare students to communicate at an advanced level in the Russian language and to gain a deep understanding of Russian culture and history. It develops students' skills to communicate effectively in various situations, including conversations, writing different types of texts, and interpretation.

Students should be able to progress from a lower level to a higher subsequent level of proficiency in the Russian language.

Specific Course Objectives:

1. Enable students to understand and analyze advanced texts in Russian, including literary, journalistic, and cultural texts, by evaluating their structure, style, and content.
2. Develop the ability to communicate fluently and accurately in various academic and cultural situations, both orally and in writing.
3. Encourage the independent and critical use of the Russian language, connecting linguistic aspects with knowledge about Russian history, culture, and literature.

Expected Learning Outcomes:

1. The course aims for practical mastery of the Russian language and equips students with basic communicative skills and habits (reading, listening, speaking, writing) within familiar topics and based on acquired lexical-grammatical material.
2. By the end of the course, students will be able to improve their oral and written expression, as well as their ability to argue different situations effectively.
3. Students will gain deeper knowledge about Russian history, culture, and literature.
4. They will develop the ability to analyze and interpret important texts in Russian, including literary works by Russian authors.
