COURSE DESCRIPTION AND LEARNING OUTCOMES :

General Course Objectives: To provide students with structured and foundational knowledge of the chronological development of British literature from the early period through Romanticism. To foster cultural and historical awareness through the study of literary and social contexts of various literary eras. To develop critical thinking and interpretative skills through the reading and discussion of representative texts.

Specific Learning Objectives:

- 1.To recognize and identify literary and cultural movements in key periods such as Early British literature, Medieval, Elizabethan, 18th-century, and Romantic literature.
- 2.To become familiar with key authors and representative works from each period, and to analyze their style, themes, and structure.
- 3.To enhance the ability to read critically and discuss literary texts with well-founded arguments, by comparing literary approaches and messages across time.

Expected Learning Outcomes:

- 1.Explain the chronological development of British literature and identify the main features of each literary period.
- 2.Analyze the works of notable British authors, incorporating stylistic, thematic, and historical-cultural elements.
- 3.Express critical viewpoints and personal interpretations of literary texts, demonstrating acquisition of literary vocabulary, contextual knowledge, and analytical proficiency.
