COURSE DESCRIPTION AND LEARNING OUTCOMES:

General Course Objectives: To provide students with a broad theoretical and historical framework on the development of modern British literature from the late 19th century to the end of World War II. To build a solid understanding of the three main literary genres—prose, poetry, and drama—during the modern period. To develop analytical and interpretive skills through the integration of theoretical knowledge and concrete literary analysis.

Specific Course Objectives:

- 1..To enable students to identify the essential features of modern British prose, poetry, and drama.
- 2.To develop the ability to analyze literary texts using concepts acquired in a chronological and thematic manner.
- 3.To encourage students to write essays, reviews, and give presentations using appropriate literary criticism terminology.
